

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



Worldwide Healthcare I.T. Systems Affected by Microsoft-CrowdStrike Outage

In late July, a widespread global IT outage, caused by a faulty software update from cvbersecurity firm CrowdStrike, wreaked havoc and affected numerous industries and services worldwide. The CrowdStrike software update triggered system problems for Microsoft Windows users, leading to extensive disruptions across various sectors. Since the outage, CrowdStrike has posted a video tutorial on how to remedy the issue.

In the healthcare industry, the impact was significant:

- 1. Healthcare providers reported outages affecting call centers, patient portals, and other critical operations.
- 2. Mass General Brigham in Boston was forced to treat only urgent cases due to the outage.
- 3. <u>Tufts Medical Center</u> warned patients about potential delays and the need for rescheduling appointments.
- 4. In Britain, booking systems used by doctors were offline, as reported by medical officials on social media.
- 5. Many health systems across the U.S. experienced delays in procedures.

The outage's effects on healthcare were part of a broader disruption that impacted airlines, banks, government agencies, and other critical services globally. While services were gradually coming back online, the incident served as a stark reminder of the healthcare industry's dependence on robust IT infrastructure and the potential consequences of system failures.

The morning of the incident, Premiers Disaster Preparedness and Response team assembled a warroom style call with supply chain leaders to discuss the situation overview, Premier supplier and member impacts, and discuss overall effects on healthcare. We quickly launched a <u>resource page on PINC AITM</u> to assist our members in navigating during this difficult time.

Global container port congestion has reached levels close to those seen during the COVID-19 pandemic, primarily due to the Red Sea crisis and strong trade volumes. The situation has led to increased shipping costs, longer transit times, and potential equipment shortages.


Global Container Port Congestion Nears Pandemic Peaks

Global <u>container port congestion</u> has reached levels approaching those seen during the COVID-19 pandemic, primarily due to the Red Sea crisis and robust trade volumes.

Current congestion is around 9 million twenty-foot equivalent unit (TEU), which is the standard unit of measurement used in shipping and logistics to measure the volume of cargo capacity in container ships. This is close to the pandemic peak of 9.6 million TEU, with the Red Sea

situation adding approximately 12 percent to TEU-mile demand. Trade volumes have grown significantly, and shippers are moving exports earlier, causing an early peak season. The rise in congestion has emerged from the impacts on port infrastructure and logistics of vessel re-routing, amplified by strong year-to-date global trade volumes, which have "grown 8 percent year-on-year from January to April".

This has led to increased shipping costs, longer transit times, and potential equipment shortages. For the healthcare industry, these developments could have significant implications. Increased shipping costs and longer transit times may drive up prices for medical supplies and equipment, while supply chain disruptions could lead to shortages of critical items.

Previously, the pharmaceutical industry, which relies heavily on global supply chains, experienced delays in receiving raw materials and shipping finished products. Overall, the healthcare industry may need to prepare for potential price increases and consider strategies to mitigate supply chain risks in this challenging logistics environment.



Canadian railway workers from the country's two largest railroads have voted overwhelmingly to authorize a potential strike. This vote doesn't guarantee immediate action but allows for a strike if a new labor agreement isn't reached. The government is currently assessing the strike's potential impact on public health and safety, and no legal strike can occur until a decision is made.

The union, representing over 9,200 workers, is seeking better wages, working conditions, and fatigue management policies. Negotiations between the union and railway companies are ongoing.

Premier's Action

Premier's dedicated Disaster Preparedness and Response team continues to monitor the situation in conjunction with logistics trends to provide members with the latest trends.



Canada Railway Workers Ratify Labor Deal

Members of the <u>Teamsters Canada Rail Conference</u>, representing over <u>9,200 workers from Canada's largest railroads</u> (Canadian National and Canadian Pacific Kansas City Southern), have voted overwhelmingly in favor of strike action. This vote, conducted between June 14 and June 29, saw 98.6% of participating members supporting the strike option.

Key Points of the Strike Authorization:

- 1. This vote does not guarantee an immediate strike, but allows for one if a new labor agreement isn't reached.
- 2. The previous contract expired on December 31, 2023.
- 3. A similar vote occurred in May, but government intervention prevented a strike.
- 4. The Canadian government is currently assessing the potential impact of a strike on public health and safety.
- No legal strike can occur until the government makes a decision to intervene, likely not before mid-July.
- 6. The union is seeking improved wages, working conditions and fatigue management policies.
- 7. Affected workers include locomotive engineers, conductors and rail traffic controllers.

The situation remains unresolved, with negotiations ongoing between the union and the railway companies since November. If a strike results, the expected impact to the U.S. healthcare supply chain is minimal.

As the September 30 deadline approaches, stakeholders across the maritime industry, retail sector, and broader economy are closely monitoring developments.

The resolution of the automation dispute in Mobile, Alabama appears to be a critical prerequisite for broader negotiations to resume. Both sides face mounting pressure to find common ground and avoid a work stoppage that could have significant national and international repercussions.

ILA Strike Threat Escalates as Contract Deadline Looms

The International Longshoremen's Association (ILA) is taking a firm stance as the September 30 contract deadline rapidly approaches for U.S. East and Gulf Coast ports. With only 80 days remaining on the current contract, ILA President Harold Daggett is warning of an increasingly likely strike, potentially disrupting operations at major maritime gateways along the Atlantic and Gulf coasts.

The current impasse in negotiations stems from a dispute over automation and jurisdiction. The ILA alleges that Maersk's APM Terminals is using an auto gate system in Mobile, Alabama, which the union claims encroach on its jurisdiction. This contentious issue has led to the cancellation of scheduled talks between the ILA and the United States Maritime Alliance (USMX), the employers' representative body.

The union has expressed concern over what it perceives as an increasing number of IT personnel on marine terminals. This trend is seen as a potential erosion of union jurisdiction and a step towards further automation.

Despite calls for government intervention, the union's president has emphatically stated that the ILA will not entertain any discussions about extending the current contract or accept help from outside agencies, including the Biden administration and the Department of Labor. Economists and trade organizations representing retailers and apparel manufacturers have voiced alarm about the potential impact of a strike on already-fragile supply chains. There are growing calls for the Biden administration to intervene and facilitate negotiations.

Historically, the ILA and USMX have successfully resolved contracts without work interruptions. The last ten contracts have been settled without strikes, with the most recent agreements in 2018 and 2012

being resolved peacefully. However, the current situation appears more volatile.

A potential ILA strike at East and Gulf Coast ports could have implications for the healthcare industry. Delays in shipments of imported medical devices, equipment and pharmaceuticals could lead to increased costs, product availability issues and/or shortages in hospitals and non-acute healthcare settings.

Despite earlier hopes for an industry turnaround, manufacturers are facing continued uncertainty due to stagnant demand, elevated supply costs, and persistent economic challenges. The upcoming U.S. presidential election is expected to contribute to market volatility, potentially affecting raw material costs, particularly for precious metals.

<u>SupplyChainDive</u> highlights ongoing concerns about labor costs and availability, with companies investing in automation to address talent shortages.

Logistics costs are also expected to rise, partly due to disruptions in the Red Sea affecting ocean freight rates and the approaching peak shipping season impacting domestic freight costs.

Premier's Action

Premier continues to closely monitor manufacturing trends, including labor costs and challenges. While this has created widespread cost pressures across supply chains, Premier's strategies are focused on leveraging its group purchasing power to insulate members from frequent price fluctuations.

One of Premier's key strategies are to negotiate fixed pricing for a longer duration under the GPO contracts. By locking in pricing for thousands of products and services for an extended period, Premier aims to provide its members with best-in-class pricing that is shielded from short-term market volatility in transportation costs.

Manufacturing Outlook 2024: Navigating Uncertainty and Rising Costs

As <u>manufacturers enter</u> the second half of 2024, they face a landscape of persistent economic uncertainty and looming political volatility. Despite earlier optimism for a market turnaround, the industry continues to grapple with elevated costs, stagnant demand and the upcoming U.S. presidential election.

Economic Uncertainty:

- Anticipated market turnaround has not materialized
- Federal Reserve has not lowered interest rates as expected
- Companies are focusing on cost management and liquidity
- Major investments in production and labor are being delayed

Supply Chain Costs:

- Geopolitical risks, including uncertainty regarding the U.S. election and ongoing conflicts, may affect supply and logistics costs
- Raw material costs for precious metals like gold, silver and copper are expected to rise 2.4 percent over the next 12 months
- Potential weakening of the U.S. dollar could impact purchasing power
- Ocean freight rates have increased due to Red Sea disruptions
- Domestic freight costs are likely to rise during peak shipping season

Labor Costs and Challenges:

- Labor costs increased year-over-year in Q1 2024
- Companies expect employee wages to rise 2.8 percent over the next 12 months
- Labor scarcity remains a significant issue, leading to increased automation investments
- Inability to attract or retain labor is the top challenge for over 65 percent of manufacturers
- Cautious hiring environment due to uncertain demand



Hurricane Beryl, the second named storm, first hurricane, and first major hurricane of the 2024 Atlantic hurricane season, made history by rapidly intensifying to become the earliest Category 5 Atlantic hurricane on record within any calendar year. Reaching its peak intensity of 165 mph on July 2, Beryl had earlier made landfall as a Category 4 hurricane in Grenada on July 1, causing extensive damage to the island nation.

On July 8, Beryl reached the Texas coast as a Category 1 hurricane.

Premier's Action

Premier's Disaster Preparedness and Response team activated their disaster protocols to initiate check-ins with leadership and our member field teams to discuss key points, member needs, supplier updates, employee well-being and more.

Hurricane Beryl's Impact on Logistics Operations

Hurricane Beryl made landfall in Texas as a Category 1 hurricane on Monday, July 8 – causing significant disruptions to logistics operations in Houston and surrounding areas. The storm's aftermath has affected various modes of regional transportation and supply chain activities.

Maritime Shipping Experienced Container Backlogs

- The <u>Port of Houston</u>, a crucial hub for international trade, faced substantial disruptions:
 - The port remained closed for two days to assess damage and make repairs
- Power outages and facility damages were primary challenges for port operations
- The Houston Ship Channel, serving over 200 terminals, experienced some disruptions
- Other Texas ports, including Brownsville, Corpus Christi and Galveston, initially closed but resumed normal operations by Monday

Air Cargo Transporation in Texas was Severely Impacted

- Approximately 1,700 flights were canceled at George Bush Intercontinental Airport (IAH) and William P. Hobby Airport (HOU)
- Cargo hubs shut down on Monday, disrupting domestic air cargo operations
- International air operations have largely returned to normal, with some carriers working through backlogs

Trucking Industry Experienced Backlogs

- Truckload <u>capacity tightened in Gulf Coast markets</u>, especially for van and flatbed freight
- Some carriers continued operations, while others halted transport to impacted areas
- LTL shipments to and from South Texas are experiencing delays
- Flooding and power outages have closed many shipper facilities, creating backlogs

While most logistics services have resumed operations, the aftermath of Hurricane Beryl continues to impact the supply chain in Texas and surrounding areas. Carriers across all modes are working to clear backlogs and return to normal operations.

Michael Foods – Avian Influenza Third Party – Notice

Two thirds of farms in the Michael Foods supply chain network have tested positive for Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI). The first farm was in Minnesota with 1.2 million layers and the second was in Iowa with 4.5 million layers. Across both farms, a blend of conventional and cage free egg layers have been lost. Unfortunately, these positives closely followed the loss of more than 8.3 million layers in Michigan and Texas in April.

The impact of these losses will cause Michael Foods to enforce a 5 percent allocation (meaning you will receive 95 percent of your allocated order) through June. This allocation began June 1 and is based on average shipments over the most recent 6 weeks. Michael Foods is working as quickly as possible on supply chain contingency planning to help minimize impact to all members.

Premier's Category Watch List | July Updates

Premier has assembled an internal team that is focused on our Category Watch List. This advisory group pulls together subject matter experts from our clinicians, supply chain experts, portfolio advisors, data teams and our Value Analysis Advisory Committee (VAAC) to surface categories and products within our portfolio that require additional supply chain risk and resiliency measures. Outside of this list, all active product disruptions are listed on our <u>Disaster Response</u> and <u>Shortages and Disruptions</u> pages within the PINC AI™ community. Each product disruption document provides the latest information on alternative suppliers, conservation strategies and get-well timelines if known.

The list is assembled based on member feedback and categorized into two phases:

Phase 1 (priority or immediate action) includes products that have limited suppliers in the market, have raw material constraints, offshore manufacturing locations and/or have increased usage throughout the membership.

Phase 2 (watching the market for disruption indicators) includes products that have limited suppliers in the market, potential raw material constraints, have offshore manufacturing locations and have increased usage during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Premier's Advocacy team shares this Watch List weekly with key government stakeholders – including the White House Supply Chain Disruptions Task Force, FDA and others. With our insights on the market and boots-on-the-groundwork in garnering vital products and supplies, Premier provides guidance on challenges, opportunities and trends – and consistently advocates for providers' needs.
